

EXTRAORDINARY INTELLIGENCE OF A DOG.

She went down to the photographer for an explanation, where she learned that the dog had that morning returned there, stationed himself before the tube, and gave the artist to understand that he wanted his picture taken. He sat perfectly still, and the artist took it.
