

The Otunui Road.

A deputation consisting of Messrs Harcourt, Greenville, McLean, Cochr, and Moorcraft waited on the Warden yesterday afternoon to the above road. Mr. Harcourt introduced the deputation, and stated that their object was to ask Mr Kenrick if he would forward a petition, which was signed by 94 persons who were either shareholders or engaged in working in the claims, asking that the road to the district be made via Hape Creek instead of by the Kaueranga Valley, as was proposed by the County Council.
