THE COUNCIL of the BOROUGH of THAMES HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that it is their intention to make a GENERAL RATE of ONE SHILLING in the £ on the Rateable Value of Property within the Borough of Thames.

Also a LIBRARY RATE of ONE PENNY in the £ on the Rateable Value of such Property aforesaid;

Also a HOSPITAL and CHARITABLE AID RATE of SEVENPENNY in the £ on the Rateable-Value of such Property aforesaid; and

Also a WATER RATE for ORDINARY SUPPLY upon all lands and buildings to which Water is supplied whose rateable value on the Valuation Roll of the Borough of Thames does not exceed twelve pounds ten shillings, a rate of seven shillings and sixpence per annum;

Exceeds twelve pounds ten shillings, but does not exceed one hundred pounds, a rate of two pounds ten shillings per cent. on such value;

Exceeds one hundred pounds, but does not exceed two hundred pounds, a rate of three per cent. on such value;

Exceeds two hundred pounds, a rate of 2½ per cent. on such value;

Upon all lands and buildings to which water can be but is not supplied, situated within one hundred yards from any part of the water works, a rate of one half of the rates above mentioned;

Upon all buildings used as stores and warehouses, or for any purposes other than as dwelling houses, a rate of two and a half per cent. on such rateable value;

And in respect of the extraordinary Water Supply such rates as are fixed by Bye-Law made in that behalf, or as may be agreed upon subject to any such Bye-Law with any person receiving such supply;

That such Rates will be for One Year, commencing on the 1st day of July, 1888, and that such Rates are payable on the 2nd day of July, 1888, and that the Rate Books are open for inspection of all Ratepayers at the Council Chambers, Thames, from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. each day, from the 16th to the 29th day of June, 1888. And the Council further notify that the following Estimate has been approved of by them.

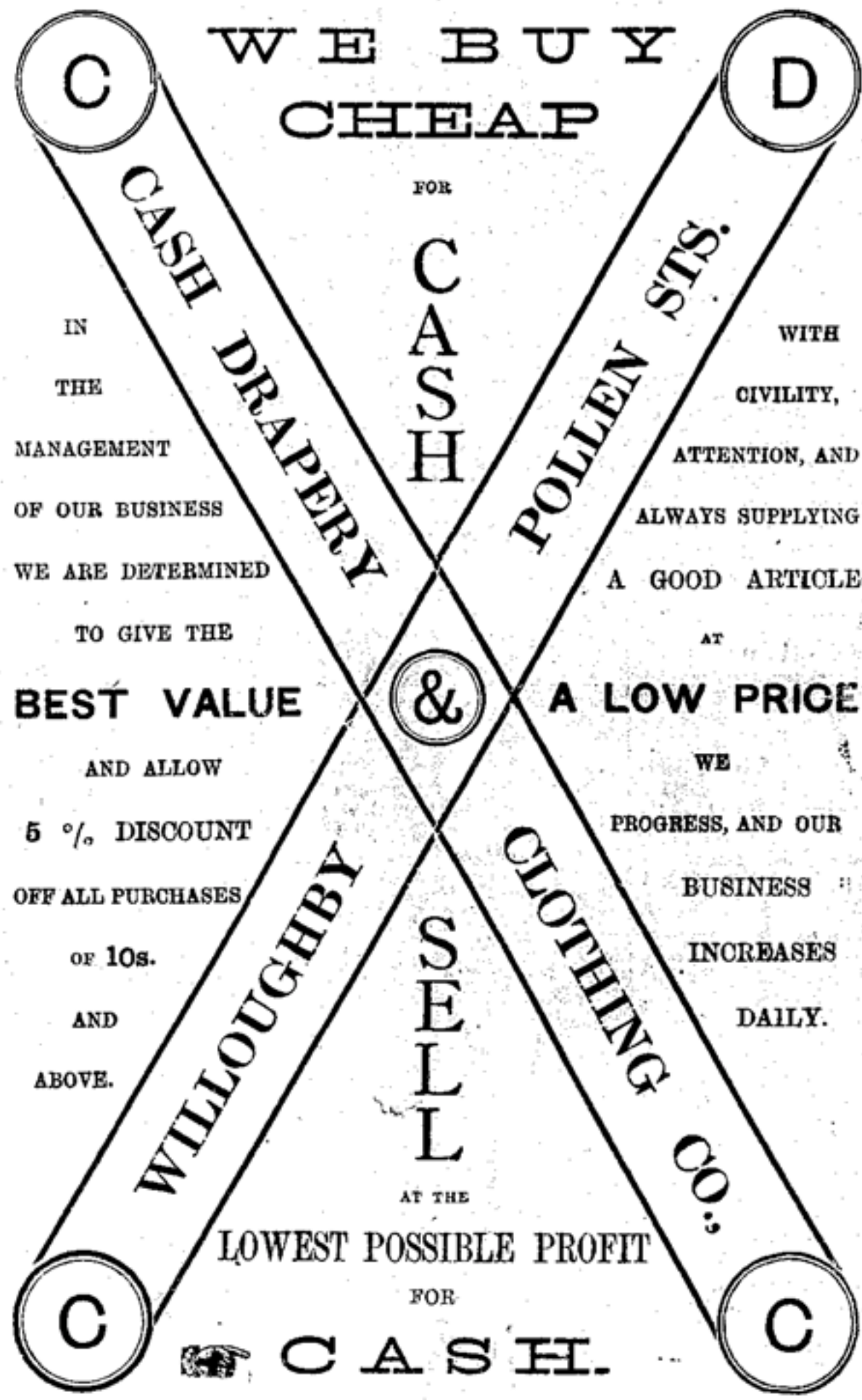
