AUCKLAND, Monday. Reference was made by one of the officers returned by the Northumberland to the disturbance at Sling Camp in March last. He stated that no Aucklanders were concerned in the riot, and that shortly before the trouble commenced the Auckland battalion was removed to another camp on Lark Hill about three miles away, because of the large number of men arriving at Sling.

AMERICAN MEMORIAL
